Camp Rates

Early Bird Price \$325*
Rate includes lodging, meals, t-shirt, water bottle, excursion to North County Aquatics Center Pool, Paddleboarding, excursion to South Beach Community Center gym, bus transportation to excursions, arts and crafts materials, curriculum booklet, and 5x7 photo of camper with their cabin mates and counselors.

A minimum \$100 per camper deposit is required to reserve a space at camp.

Reservations are guaranteed only once the camper deposit payment has been received, and full payment is received two week prior to arrival. Please be aware that some weeks of camp may be full several weeks prior to early registration.

*Early Bird discount applies if all fees are paid by May 15, 2012

Balance Due & Refund Policy

Full registration balance is due two weeks before arrival. A refund may be given if camper cancels with valid reason (in writing) at least two weeks before his/her camp session starts. If cancellation is received less than two weeks before his/her camp session starts, no refund will be given unless we are able to fill your child's spot. If we can fill their spot, a full refund less \$25 will be given. No refund will be given to a camper who becomes ill during camp and goes home, or if a camper is sent home for behavioral reasons or chooses to go home for any reason.

We are located about 15 miles South of Melbourne Beach on A1A on the right hand side, or 2 miles North of the Sebastian Inlet bridge on the left.

Medical Forms

Must be completed and Notarized prior to camp. A minor CANNOT remain at camp without a signed and notarized form on file.

Cabin Buddy

There are 6 to 8 campers and 2 counselors in each cabin. During registration, you can request a "cabin buddy", however they must be within the same approximate age (1 to 2 year range) and must be the same gender. We will make every attempt to meet your cabin request. Shiloh Adventure Camp reserves the right to modify "cabin buddy" requests based on availability or circumstances that may effect the well being of your child or other children in the cabin.

Check-In

On Sunday afternoon please arrive no earlier than 4pm and no later than 5pm. Tell the guard at the front that you are going to Shiloh Camp and they will let you enter with no charge. The Check-in process includes: Registration and forms check, Medical Check-in and screening (for contagious illness and headlice), cabin assignments, meet your counselor. Upon arrival proceed to the Check-in tent at the Office.

Medical Check & Camper Meds

At Medical Check-in all camper medications must be turned in, the Medical Info & Consent form will be reviewed and each camper will go through medical screening. If a camper has a contagious illness, headlice, lice eggs (nits), or a notarized Medical form is not available, he/she will be sent home. We have a registered nurse on-site or on call 24 hours a day. We are also equipped with a Nurse Station that is capable of taking care of most minor injuries and illnesses. The Camp Nurse will also administer all medications. All meds must be in original pharmacy containers with the prescription and camper's name indicated. NO loose unmarked medicines. Suggest placing meds in a zip-lock bag with camper's name on it. Over the counter meds are not needed – Nurse Station will provide.

Temporary Check-out from Camp

We ask that your campers not leave during the week. Leaving takes them away from an important part of the camp experience and disrupts camp for them and the rest of the campers. However, if you have to check out your child for a doctor's appointment or other reason, please call the camp office ahead of time and check in at the office before meeting with your child. No unannounced visits are permitted. Please note, only the approved persons including parents/guardians on the Authorized Release form may check out the camper with proof of ID and signature.

Pick-up / Closing Ceremonies

Again, please note, only approved persons listed on the Authorized Release form may pick up campers. They will be asked to provide ID and sign check out form.

On Friday evening please be there at 5:30 for closing ceremonies. Closing ceremonies will end at 6:45. Campers will not be released until the end of closing ceremonies so please plan accordingly.

Lost and Found

At the end of Closing Ceremonies, parents/guardians please be sure to stop by the lost and found to ensure your camper's stuff does not get left behind. Camp is under no obligation to replace lost clothing. Each Camper is responsible for his/her belongings.

Communication with Camper

Campers will not be allowed to make outgoing phone calls. To protect camper morale, no incoming calls are allowed. Emergencies will be carefully handled by the Camp Director. A one-way email communication to Campers option is available through our website. Emails are delivered once daily to Campers.

Cell Phones

In order to keep the campers from being distracted and to minimize the chance of stolen phones, we ask that NO cell phones be brought to camp. If a camper brings one or is found with one it will be turned into the office and given back at final check-out. Of course if there is an emergency, you will be able to get in touch with your child by calling our main office number 321.452.3943.

Snail Mail/Care Packages/Email

We encourage parents to send letters, emails or a care package during the week of camp. Please plan ahead so that your camper can receive them well before they leave camp! Send cheerful letters with a positive focus on camp, not what they are missing at home. Campers are also allowed ONE Care Package for the week. Please limit the amount of candy, food and beverages. Keep in mind, food/drinks are not allowed in the cabins.

Camp Store

Our camp store provides beverages, ice cream and other goodies along with Shiloh T-Shirts (not the same as camp T-Shirt) and other Shiloh Adventure Camp merchandise. You can pre-order a camp card (when you register your child) that can be loaded with amounts ranging from \$10 to \$60 per week per child. We recommend a balance of anywhere from \$10 to \$30 per week. A remaining balance of less than \$10 will be treated as a donation to camp. Balances over \$10 will be refunded at check-out.

What to bring to camp

NOTE: Mark everything possible with your camper's name on it! Use a permanent marker (Sharpie) that won't wash out.

Also suggest packing clean clothes in large zip-lock bags to keep them clean and dry!

- 7 T-Shirts (for Girls)
- 1 Mesh laundry bag or pillow case for dirty/wet clothes

OPTIONAL What to Bring

Journal, Stationary/stamps, disposable camera, snorkel & mask, ski vest/pfd.

DO NOT bring to camp

Cell Phones, Radios, Walkmans, CD players, Ipods, Gameboys, TV's, comics, squirt guns, waterballoons, skateboards, rollerblades, items of high sentimental value, expensive jewelry, knives or other weapons, fireworks, tobacco, alcohol or drugs.

If any of these items are brought to camp, the camper will not be allowed to keep them in their possession during camp.

Camp Style and Dress

Athletic shoes, shorts, shirts and socks are to be worn at all times unless otherwise specified. Any clothing with questionable words, rock or "goth" style is not allowed. Punk hairstyles and un-natural hair colors are not allowed. Earrings and long hair are not allowed for boys. Girls are allowed no more than 2 stud earrings per ear. Absolutely No pierced body parts allowed. "Short shorts" and "spaghetti straps" are not allowed and expensive outfits are not necessary.

Proper Camp Behavior

It is our belief that every part of the camp week is vital, from the morning devotions and afternoon activities to the live worship and evening teaching. We ask parents to urge their campers to be joyful participants and to be on their best behavior for the good of the camp. Please go over the following Shiloh Camp rules with your camper prior to arrival.

1. No fighting
2. No throwing sticks or stones
3. No starting or playing w/ fire
4. No smoking, alcohol or drugs
5. No damage to property
6. No littering
7. No food or drinks in cabins
8. No pranks, water balloons, shaving cream or pillow fights
9. Camper to remain w/ their Counselor while outside the Shiloh "home zone"
10. Leave animals and nature as you found it
11. You are responsible for anything you break
12. Everyone must wear protective gear such as bike helmets or personal flotation devices (while boating or canoeing)

Camp Director shall exercise full discretion to have serious or repeat offenders sent home from camp.
